Dr. Nyama McCarthy-Brown is an Assistant Professor of Dance Pedagogy Through Community Engagement, at The Ohio State University. Nyama is an active educator, artist, and scholar. In 2017, her first book, *Dance Pedagogy for a Diverse World* was released. Dr. McCarthy-Brown, often called "Nya," is an active consultant and workshop facilitator for organizations such as: San Francisco Ballet, Joffrey Ballet, Enrich Chicago, Dance Educators Coalition, Rutgers Dance Department, and The University of Buffalo Dance Department.



Takiyah Nur Amin, MFA; PhD is a dance scholar, educator, and consultant. Her research focuses on 20th-century American concert

dance, African diaspora dance performance/aesthetics, and pedagogical issues in dance studies. She is a founding executive board member of the Collegium for African Diaspora Dance (CADD) and Vice President for Membership for the Dance Studies Association (DSA). Dr. Amin consults with institutional clients on curricular design, policy reform, and issues pursuant to anti-racism and diversity in dance studies and related disciplines.
