

National Core Arts Standards (NCAS): Artistic Processes and Anchor Standards

The current set of arts standards emerges from the Artistic Processes of Creating, Performing/Presenting/Producing, Responding, and Connecting. Each artistic process branches into two or three anchor standards. The performance standards, which describe student learning in each of the specific arts disciplines, align with anchor standards. Collectively, the design reflects a cohesive and aligned system that allows for commonality across the disciplines and specificity within each discipline, therefore establishing the appropriate level of breadth and depth required for national standards.

They translate the anchor standards into specific, measurable learning goals.
